Instructions for Submitting a Solicitation Response

The Department of Corrections is now posting some of its bid solicitation documents on the new MissouriBUYS Bid Board (<https://www.missouribuys.mo.gov>). MissouriBUYS is the State of Missouri's web-based statewide eProcurement system which is powered by WebProcure, through our partner, Perfect Commerce.

For all bid solicitations, bidders now have the option of submitting their solicitation response either as an electronic response or as a hard copy response. As a means to save bidders the expense of submitting a hard copy response and to provide bidders both the ease and the timeliness of responding from a computer, bidders are encouraged to submit an electronic response. Both methods of submission are explained briefly below and in more detail in the step-by-step instructions provided at:

(This document is also on the Bid Board referenced above.).

Notice: The bidder is solely responsible for ensuring timely submission of their solicitation response, whether submitting an online response or a hard copy response. Failure to allow adequate time prior to the solicitation end date to complete and submit a response to a solicitation, particularly in the event technical support assistance is required, places the bidder and their response at risk of not being accepted on time.

- **ELECTRONIC RESPONSES:** To respond electronically to a solicitation, the bidder must first register as a vendor with MissouriBUYS by going to the MissouriBUYS Home Page at (<https://missouribuys.mo.gov>), clicking the "Register" button at the top of the page, and completing the Vendor Registration. 1. INTRODUCTION AND GENERAL INFORMATION

This section of the IFB includes a brief introduction and background information about the intended services for which the requirements herein are written. The contents of this section are intended for informational purposes and do not require a response.

1.1 Purpose:

- 1.1.1 The Missouri Department of Corrections (hereinafter referred to as the Department) is accepting competitive, sealed bids to establish a contract for standard definition cable/satellite television service for Missouri Eastern Correctional Center (hereinafter referred to as MECC) located at the following address.

- 1.1.2 This is a rebid of IFB 931ER234N9020. No contract was awarded for that IFB.

1.2 Questions Regarding the IFB:

- 1.2.1 IFB Questions - It is the bidder's responsibility to ask questions, request changes or clarifications, or otherwise advise the Department of Corrections (DOC) if the bidder believes that any language, specifications, or requirements are: (1) ambiguous, (2) contradictory or arbitrary, or both, (3) violate any state or federal law or regulation, (4) restrict or limit the requirements to a single source, or (5) restrict or limit the bidder's ability to submit a bid.
- a. Except as may be otherwise stated herein, the bidder and the bidder's agents (including subcontractors, employees, consultants, or anyone else acting on their behalf) must direct all of their questions or comments regarding the IFB, the solicitation process, the evaluation, etc., to the buyer of record indicated on the first page of this IFB. Inappropriate contacts to other personnel are grounds for suspension and/or exclusion from specific procurements. Bidders and their agents who have questions regarding this matter should contact the buyer.
 - 1) The bidder may contact the Office of Equal Opportunity (OEO) regarding MBE/WBE certification or subcontracting with MBE/WBE companies.
 - b. All questions and issues should be submitted at least ten (10) working days prior to the due date of the bid. If not received prior to ten (10) working days before the bid due date, the DOC may not be able to fully research and consider the respective questions or issues. Questions and issues relating to the IFB, including all questions related to the competitive procurement process, must be directed to the buyer. It is preferred that questions be e-mailed to the buyer at steven.beeson@doc.mo.gov.
 - c. The DOC will attempt to ensure that a bidder receives an adequate and prompt response to questions, if applicable. Upon DOC's consideration of questions and issues, if the DOC determines that changes are necessary, the resulting changes will be included in a subsequently issued IFB amendment(s); absence of such response indicates that the questions and issues were considered but deemed unnecessary for IFB amendment as the questions and issues did not provide further clarity to the IFB. All bidders will be advised of any change to the IFB's language, specifications, or requirements by a formal amendment to the IFB.

NOTE: The only official position of the State of Missouri shall be that which is contained in the IFB and any amendments thereto.

1.3 Vendor Information:

- 1.3.1 The Missouri Department of Corrections has transitioned to the MissouriBUYS eProcurement system. All vendors that sell products or services to the state, new or existing, are required to register or re-register on the MissouriBUYS website at <https://MissouriBUYS.mo.gov>. Please note that there are written instructions on the "Register" tab, as well as a Vendor Training Video.
- a. The vendor shall understand and agree that in order to be considered for a contract award, they must be registered in MissouriBUYS.

1.4 Tour of Facility:

- 1.4.1 Non-mandatory site tours are available by appointment. To make an appointment for a site tour, please contact Jessica Poschel, MECC Business Manager, by phone at (636) 257-3322 extension 1300, or email at jessica.poschel@doc.mo.gov, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., at least four (4) days prior to desired tour date.
- a. Any potential bidder interested in participating in a site inspection must provide the full name and valid Missouri driver's license number of each individual planning to attend a site inspection. If the bidder does not have a valid Missouri driver's license, their social security number and date of birth are required.
- b. Each potential bidder is limited to two (2) individuals at the site inspection.
- c. Each person attending the site inspection will be required to have a valid government issued ID. Cell phones, cameras, tape recorders, and purses will not be permitted inside the facility.
- d. The Department reserves the right to accept or reject any person requesting a site inspection.
- e. Other than the questions related to the tour, all questions regarding the Invitation for Bid and/or the competitive procurement process must be directed to Steven Beeson, Procurement Officer, at (573) 526-6590 or steven.beeson@doc.mo.gov.
- f. Unless a bidder has specific current knowledge of the facility, the bidder is encouraged to tour the facility prior to submission of a bid. Specific current knowledge of the facility includes being a current contractor/subcontractor within the facility or having provided services within the facility within the past five (5) years.
- 1.4.2 The purpose of the tour is to provide bidders an opportunity to inspect, examine, and assess the facility and to determine any existing conditions and factors of the facility that may affect the performance of the services required herein.
- 1.4.3 Each bidder is solely responsible for a prudent and complete personal inspection, examination, and assessment of the building and any other existing condition, factor, or item that may affect or impact the performance of service described and required in the Contractual Requirements. The bidder shall not be relieved of responsibility for performance under the contract for any reason whatsoever, including, but not limited to, the bidder's failure to observe existing conditions, etc.
- 1.4.4 Bidders are strongly encouraged to advise the Department, at least five (5) days prior to the scheduled tour of the facility, of any special accommodations needed for disabled personnel who will be attending the tour so that the accommodations can be made.
- 1.4.5 All questions regarding the IFB and/or the competitive procurement process must be directed to the buyer of record as noted on the cover page of the IFB.

1.5 Background and Historical Usage Information:

- 1.5.1 The MECC has a capacity of 1,100 medium/minimum class offenders and a staff of 432.
- a. MECC has approximately 540 drops. The Department defines a drop as a permanent outlet to access the SD cable satellite system.
 - b. MECC has 512 two (2) man cells with one drop each where splitters may be installed.
- 1.5.2 Each drop may not have a splitter or a television attached at all times. The number of televisions in use changes daily. The number of drops and possible number of splitters represents the maximum number of televisions that may be in use and is provided for informational purposes.
- 1.5.3 The Department requires that the Trinity Broadcast Network (TBN) Second Chance channels be a part of the required channel lineup. Information regarding the programming of Trinity Broadcasting Network Second Chance can be found at www.tbnsecondchance.org. Cable and satellite provider information regarding Trinity Broadcasting Second Chance may be obtained by contacting Robert Higley, Vice President of Affiliate Sales and Relations, Trinity Broadcast Network, 972-313-9500 option 1.
- 1.5.4 The format of **EXHIBIT A, Pricing Page** of this IFB has been revised from previous bids issued by the Department. Bidders should review **EXHIBIT A, Pricing Page** carefully. The Department will no longer pay a one-time cost for equipment, installation, and set-up. All cost for equipment, installation, and set-up shall be built into the monthly service charge.
- 1.5.5 Although an attempt has been made to provide accurate and up-to-date information, the State of Missouri does not warrant or represent that the background information provided herein reflects all relationships or existing conditions related to this Request for Bid.
- 1.5.6 A current contract exists for the services being obtained via this IFB. The contract number is: CN1614801.

2. SCOPE OF WORK

This section of the IFB includes requirements and provisions relating specifically to the performance requirements of the Department. The contents of this section include mandatory requirements that will be required of the successful bidder and subsequent contractor. Response to this section by the bidder is requested in the Exhibit section of this IFB. The bidder's response, whether responding to a mandatory requirement or a desired attribute will be binding upon the bidder in the event the bid is accepted by the Department.

2.1 General Requirements:

- 2.1.1 The contractor shall provide the provision of SD cable/satellite services for the Department of Corrections (hereinafter referred to as the Department), Missouri Eastern Correctional Center (hereinafter referred to as MECC), in accordance with the provisions and requirements stated herein and to the sole satisfaction of the Department.
- 2.1.2 The contractor must provide all equipment and the maintenance/repair related to the SD cable television service.
 - a. The contractor shall be responsible for installation, maintenance, and repair of all equipment and wiring up to and including the head end. The Department shall be responsible for all equipment and wiring past the head end.
 - b. The contractor shall install the head end at the institution.
- 2.1.3 The contractor shall understand and agree that because the contractor was familiar with the facility and the conditions that existed prior to award of the contract, the contractor shall not be relieved of the performance of the provisions and requirements specified herein.
- 2.1.4 The contractor shall have at least three (3) years of experience providing services of similar scope and size to the requirements identified herein.

2.2 Equipment and Supply Requirements:

- 2.2.1 The contractor must furnish and maintain in good repair all equipment, including, but not limited to, dishes, antennas, TVROS, modulators, amplifiers, taps, and wiring, and any other equipment necessary to perform the requirements of the contract.
 - a. The contractor may either own or rent, at the contractor's expense, equipment for performing the requirements of the contract.
 - b. Any cable/wiring installed within the facility, past the head end, becomes the property of the Department once installed.
 - c. The repair, maintenance, and replacement of contractor supplied equipment, as necessary, shall be at no cost to the Department.
 - d. If providing a satellite service, the contractor shall not supply more than two dishes not-to-exceed forty-two inches (42") in diameter. If the dishes are not round, the largest dimension shall not exceed forty-two inches (42").
 - 1) If necessary, a third dish not to exceed forty-two inches (42") in diameter may be utilized for the TBN Second Chance Channels.
 - 2) The placement, method of mounting, and cable run of satellite dishes must be approved by the Department.

- 3) If providing satellite service and using satellite dishes forty-two inches (42") or less, the contractor must provide heaters on the dishes with an on-off switch at the head end.
 - e. Receivers must be properly balanced in order to minimize the possibility of channel bleed-over.
 - f. Any additional equipment required in order to maintain the required channel selection due to signal change, changes in technology, etc., shall be the responsibility of the contractor.
 - g. The head end rooms at the Department are air conditioned to the building settings. Any additional cooling requirements to properly maintain the equipment (i.e. rack fans) are the responsibility of the contractor, and must be per industry standards and NEC 2011 requirements.
 - h. **R-rated or above programming must not broadcast under any circumstances.** Therefore, the contractor must supply the necessary equipment to block any R-rated or above programming. This shall include, but not be limited to, any trial offer previews or channels that may broadcast R-rated or above programming.
 - i. The Department will provide sufficient space and the necessary electrical power for the system to successfully run the cable system.
 - j. All replacement equipment must current market technology at time of installation. This includes all equipment prior to and including connection to the head end.
- 2.2.2 Contractor should complete and submit, **EXHIBIT B, Equipment**, to list the equipment necessary to provide the required services stated herein.

2.3 Service Requirements:

- 2.3.1 The contractor must provide clear signal to all television locations. The signal strength must be a minimum of 17.0 db at the head end. The contractor must have the capability for each television to view different channels simultaneously on owner furnished, cable-ready televisions.
- 2.3.2 **The use of individual cable boxes is prohibited.**
- 2.3.3 The contractor must provide all of the channels listed in Attachment 1, Required Channels. If any channels listed on Attachment 1 cannot be provided, the contractor must suggest a channel(s) equal to or better in quality to the channel that is being replaced.
- a. Any replacement channels must be approved by the Department prior to being made available for viewing.
 - b. The contractor must provide additional standard channels on an ala carte basis. All additional channels must be approved by the Department.
 - c. The contractor may provide additional no-charge channels. Additional no-charge channels must be approved by the Department.
Other additional channels may be added by written amendment at a price mutually agreed upon by the Department and the contractor.
 - d. Premium or pay-per-view channels (HBO, Showtime, etc.) shall not be permitted.
 - e. In the event that a required channel ceases operation during the contract period, the contractor shall offer a replacement channel that is mutually acceptable to both the contractor and the Department. The contractor must provide documentation in the form of written verification from the originating

broadcaster or a news release from a reputable trade publication or news source that the channel is ceasing operation.

- f. In the event that a contractor's broadcast agreement for a required channel expires and is not renewed during the contract period, the contractor shall offer a replacement channel that is mutually acceptable to both the contractor and the Department. The contractor must provide written verification from the originating broadcaster or the parent satellite provider documenting that the channel is no longer available. If a broadcast agreement is reached and the channel in question becomes available again, the contractor must re-add it to the channel lineup.
 - 1) ESPN, Fox Sports Midwest and/or Fox Sports Kansas City, and Trinity Broadcast Network Second Chance Channels are exceptions as these channels are essential to the Department's operations. The contractor must provide all of these channels at all times.
- g. If at any time the Department determines the programming content of any of the mandatory or optional channels is not appropriate for a correctional facility, the contractor shall be required to block the channels upon written request.
 - 1) In the event the contractor becomes aware, or is concerned the programming being provided on a channel is not appropriate for a correctional facility, the contractor must contact the Department to determine if the channel needs to be blocked and/or replaced.
- h. The contractor must provide a minimum of two (2) institutional channels for the Department's use. The institutional channels must be capable of showing rented movies and character generated messages within the facility.
- i. VCRs, DVD players and character generators shall be supplied by the Department.
- j. The contractor shall ensure that the Department has ability to install VCRs, DVD players, and character generators at a location other than the head end as designated by the Department.

2.3.4 Response to service calls must be as soon as possible and within twenty-four (24) hours. Service interruptions beyond twenty-four (24) hours shall be deducted from the monthly billing

- a. Individual channel outages beyond twenty-four (24) hours shall be pro-rated and deducted from the monthly billing.
- b. Service interruptions **MUST** not affect the institutional channels or the ability to show movies within the institution.

2.4 Maintenance/Technical Support Requirements:

2.4.1 Preventative maintenance reviews shall be conducted semi-annually.

- a. Preventive maintenance shall include, but not be limited to, checking signal strength at the head end, testing satellite dish alignment (if applicable), making any necessary adjustments or replacements to any equipment, checking for loose connections and cracked cable shielding, etc.
- b. Preventive maintenance reviews must be conducted on-site and not remotely.

2.4.2 The contractor shall assist the Department by providing recommendations such as system settings, equipment upgrades, design updates, maintenance, or other recommendations or instructions as requested, to enable proper signal distribution and ease of maintenance.

2.4.3 The contractor must provide the Department a contact phone number which the agency can use to report technical system problems. This phone number, if not a direct contact line to the contractor support structure, must provide a maximum of sixty (60) minute call back response by contractor personnel. It is highly desirable that the contractor provides a toll free telephone number for support.

2.4.4 Unless otherwise specified herein, the contractor shall furnish all material, labor, facilities, equipment, and supplies necessary to perform the services required herein.

2.5 Travel Expenses:

2.5.1 The contractor's personnel may be required to travel to locations other than their primary work place (i.e. work on-site at the ordering agency facility), and will only be necessary for install and service issues. The contractor shall not be reimbursed for any travel expenses, and any costs must be built into the monthly rate detailed on **EXHIBIT A, Pricing Page**.

2.6 Invoicing and Payment Requirements:

2.6.1 The contractor shall accurately invoice per the price indicated on **EXHIBIT A, Pricing Page**.

2.6.2 If the Department issues a purchase order, an itemized invoice shall be emailed to doc.payables@doc.mo.gov or mailed to:

2.6.3 Each invoice submitted must be specific to one purchase order number, referenced on the invoice, and must be itemized in accordance with items listed on the purchase order. Failure to comply with this requirement may delay processing of invoices for payment. Emailed invoices should contain the purchase order number in the subject line.

2.6.4 If the state purchasing card (Visa) is to be used for payment, an itemized invoice reflecting the charged amount must be faxed or emailed to the institution within one business day.

2.6.5 The contractor's invoice should include any discount for prompt payment as indicated on **EXHIBIT A, Pricing Page**.

2.6.6 If the contractor maintains an e-commerce web application that enables Department staff to view and print invoices and invoice history, the contractor shall indicate on **EXHIBIT A, Pricing Page** the web site address where Department staff may access invoices. Upon award of contract, the contractor shall provide the Department with a customer number in order for Department staff to access invoices and invoice history.

2.6.7 All payment terms shall be as stated in the terms and conditions of this contract. Payments will be processed based on final delivery, inspection, and acceptance of the items.

2.6.8 The Department may choose to use the state purchasing card (Visa) in place of a purchase order to make purchases under this contract. Unless exception to this condition is indicated on **EXHIBIT A, Pricing Page**, the contractor agrees to accept the state purchasing card as an acceptable form of payment and may not charge any additional fees related to the use of a purchasing card such as service fees, merchant fees, and/or handling charges. **The state purchasing card shall not be charged until the items are received and accepted.**

- 2.6.9 The Department does not pay state or federal sales tax. The Department shall not make additional payments or pay add-on charges.
- 2.6.10 Other than the payments specified above, no other payments or reimbursements shall be made to the contractor for any reason whatsoever including, but not limited to, taxes, lodging, per diem costs, shipping charges, insurance, interest, penalties, termination payments, attorney fees, liquidated damages, etc.

END OF PART TWO: SCOPE OF WORK

3. GENERAL CONTRACTUAL REQUIREMENTS:

This section of the IFB includes the general contractual requirements and provisions that shall govern the contract after IFB award. The contents of this section include mandatory provisions that must be adhered to by the state and the contractor unless changed by a contract amendment. Response to this section by the bidder is not necessary as all provisions are mandatory.

3.1 Contractual Requirements:

- 3.1.1 Contract - A binding contract shall consist of: (1) the IFB and any amendments thereto, (2) the contractor's response (bid) to the IFB, (3) clarification of the bid, if any, and (4) the Department's acceptance of the response (bid) by "notice of award". All Exhibits and Attachments included in the IFB shall be incorporated into the contract by reference.
- a. A notice of award issued by the State of Missouri does not constitute an authorization for shipment of equipment or supplies or a directive to proceed with services. Before providing equipment, supplies and/or services for the State of Missouri, the contractor must receive a properly authorized purchase order or other form of authorization given to the contractor at the discretion of the Department.
 - b. The contract expresses the complete agreement of the parties and performance shall be governed solely by the specifications and requirements contained therein.
 - c. Any change to the contract, whether by modification and/or supplementation, must be accomplished by a formal contract amendment signed and approved by and between the duly authorized representative of the contractor and the Department prior to the effective date of such modification. The contractor expressly and explicitly understands and agrees that no other method and/or no other document, including correspondence, acts, and oral communications by or from any person, shall be used or construed as an amendment or modification to the contract.
- 3.1.2 Contract Period - The original contract period shall be as stated on the Notice of Award. The contract shall not bind, nor purport to bind, the state for any contractual commitment in excess of the original contract period. The Department shall have the right, at its sole option, to renew the contract for three (3) additional one-year periods, or any portion thereof. In the event the Department exercises such right, all terms and conditions, requirements and specifications of the contract shall remain the same and apply during the renewal period, pursuant to applicable option clauses of this document.
- 3.1.3 Renewal Periods - If the option for renewal is exercised by the Department, the contractor shall agree that the prices for the renewal period shall not exceed the maximum price for the applicable renewal period stated on the Pricing Page of the contract.
- a. If renewal prices are not provided, then prices during renewal periods shall be the same as during the original contract period.
 - b. In addition, the contractor shall understand and agree that renewal period price increases specified in the contract are not automatic. At the time of contract renewal, if the state determines funding does not permit the specified renewal pricing increase or even a portion thereof, the renewal pricing shall remain the same as during the previous contract period. If such action is rejected by the contractor, the contract may be terminated, and a new procurement process may be conducted. The contractor shall also understand and agree the state may determine funding limitations necessitate a decrease in the contractor's pricing for the renewal period(s). If such action is necessary and the contractor rejects the decrease, the contract may be terminated, and a new procurement process may be conducted.

- 3.1.4 Contract Price - All prices shall be as indicated on the EXHIBIT A, Pricing Page. The state shall not pay nor be liable for any other additional costs including but not limited to taxes, shipping charges, insurance, interest, penalties, termination payments, attorney fees, liquidated damages, etc.
- a. Prices shall include all packing, handling, shipping and freight charges FOB Destination, Freight Prepaid and Allowed. The State of Missouri shall not make additional payments or pay add-on charges for freight or shipping unless specifically described and priced in the bid, or as otherwise specifically stated and allowed by the IFB.
- 3.1.5 Cable/Satellite Service Charge: Upon written documentation of a price increase from the signal provider, an increase in the cable/satellite service charge price will be allowed one time during the original contract period and one time during each renewal period. Such written documentation must be provided at least thirty (30) days prior to the requested price increase. Any programming charge increases shall be subject to approval by the Department and will be documented by a contract amendment.
- 3.1.6 Taxes and fees: Price changes on applicable taxes, FCC fee, franchise fees, and other non-service or non-programming fees may be implemented upon proof of change of the taxes and fees by the taxing entity. The contractor must provide written documentation of such changes to the Department prior to implementing the increase.
- a. The Department does not pay state sales tax.
- 3.1.7 The Department shall not pay nor be liable for any other additional costs, including but not limited to taxes, shipping charges, insurance, interest penalties, termination payments, attorney fees, liquidated damages, etc.
- 3.1.8 Termination - The Department reserves the right to terminate the contract at any time, for the convenience of the State of Missouri, without penalty or recourse, by giving written notice to the contractor at least thirty (30) calendar days prior to the effective date of such termination. The contractor shall be entitled to receive compensation for services and/or supplies delivered to and accepted by the State of Missouri pursuant to the contract prior to the effective date of termination.
- 3.1.9 Transition - Upon award of the contract, the contractor shall work with the Department and any other organizations designated by the Department to ensure an orderly transition of services and responsibilities under the contract and to ensure the continuity of those services required by the Department.
- a. The contractor must be able to provide full service within ninety (90) days after notice of award.
 - b. Upon expiration, termination, or cancellation of the contract, the contractor shall assist the Department to ensure an orderly and smooth transfer of responsibility and continuity of those services required under the terms of the contract to an organization designated by the Department.
 - c. If requested, the contractor shall agree to continue providing any or all of the services in accordance with the terms and conditions, requirements, specifications, and payment provisions of the contract for a period not to exceed one hundred eighty (180) calendar days after the expiration date of the contract or until a new contract is established.
 - d. Contractor shall be responsible for the removal and disposal of existing equipment which does not belong to MECC, and does not conform to the specifications outlined herein.
- 3.1.10 Usage Agreements - The contractor shall understand and agree that the Department shall not execute usage agreements and/or any other agreements with the contractor or any other third party in the performance of this contract.

- 3.1.11 Contractor Liability - The contractor shall be responsible for any and all personal injury (including death) or property damage as a result of the contractor's negligence involving any equipment or service provided under the terms and conditions, requirements and specifications of the contract. In addition, the contractor assumes the obligation to save the Department, including its divisions, employees, and assignees, from every expense, liability, or payment arising out of such negligent act. The contractor also agrees to hold the Department, including its divisions, employees, and assignees, harmless for any negligent act or omission committed by any subcontractor or other person employed by or under the supervision of the contractor under the terms of the contract.
- a. The contractor shall forever defend, protect, and hold harmless the Department, against all suits in law or in equity resulting from the contractor's failure to properly pay programming fees, incorrectly report drop counts or any failure on its part in performing per the programming agreements with the signal providers.
- 3.1.12 Insurance - The contractor shall understand and agree that the State of Missouri cannot save and hold harmless and/or indemnify the contractor or employees against any liability incurred or arising as a result of any activity of the contractor or any activity of the contractor's employees related to the contractor's performance under the contract. Therefore, the contractor must acquire and maintain adequate liability insurance in the form(s) and amount(s) sufficient to protect the State of Missouri, its agencies, its employees, its clients, and the general public against any such loss, damage and/or expense related to his/her performance under the contract. General and other non-professional liability insurance shall include an endorsement that adds the State of Missouri as an additional insured. Self-insurance coverage or another alternative risk financing mechanism may be utilized provided that such coverage is verifiable and irrevocably reliable and the State of Missouri is protected as an additional insured.
- a. In the event the insurance coverage is canceled, the Department must be notified within thirty (30) calendar days.
- 3.1.13 Subcontractors - Any subcontracts for the services described herein, must include appropriate provisions and contractual obligations to ensure the successful fulfillment of all contractual obligations agreed to by the contractor and the Department and to ensure that the Department is indemnified, saved, and held harmless from and against any and all claims of damage, loss, and cost (including attorney fees) of any kind, related to a subcontract in those matters described in the contract between the Department and the contractor.
- a. The contractor shall expressly understand and agree that he/she shall assume and be solely responsible for all legal and financial responsibilities related to the execution of a subcontract.
 - b. The contractor shall agree and understand that utilization of a subcontractor to provide any of the products/services in the contract shall in no way relieve the contractor of the responsibility for providing the products/services as described and set forth herein.
 - c. The contractor must function as the single point of contact for the Department, regardless of any subcontract arrangements made, for all products and services provided, including but not limited to, issues related to delivery, restocking, maintenance and commission payment.
 - d. Pursuant to subsection 1 of section 285.530, RSMo, no contractor or subcontractor shall knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien to perform work within the state of Missouri. In accordance with sections 285.525 to 285.550, RSMo, a general contractor or subcontractor of any tier shall not be liable when such contractor or subcontractor contracts with its direct subcontractor who violates subsection 1 of section 285.530, RSMo, if the contract binding the contractor and subcontractor affirmatively states that:

- 1) The direct subcontractor is not knowingly in violation of subsection 1 of section 285.530, RSMo, and shall not henceforth be in such violation.
- 2) The contractor or subcontractor receives a sworn affidavit under the penalty of perjury attesting to the fact that the direct subcontractor's employees are lawfully present in the United States.

3.1.14 Contractor's Employees - The contractor and all of the contractor's employees and agents providing services in any Department of Corrections institution must be at least 18 years of age. A Missouri Uniform Law Enforcement System (MULES) check or other background investigation may be required on the contractor, the contractor's employees and agents before they are allowed entry into the institution. The contractor, its employees, and its agents understand and agree that the Department may complete criminal background records checks every year for the contractor and the contractor's employees and agents that have the potential to have contact with offenders.

- a. The institution shall have the right to deny access into the institution for the contractor and any of the contractor's employees and agents for any reason, at the discretion of the institution.
- b. The contractor, its employees, and its agents under active federal or state felony or misdemeanor supervision must receive written division director approval prior to providing services pursuant to a Department contract. Similarly, contractors/employees/agents with prior felony convictions and not under active supervision must receive written division director approval in advance.
- c. The contractor, its employees, and its agents shall at all times observe and comply with all applicable state statutes, Department rules, regulations, guidelines, internal management policies and procedures, and general orders of the Department that are applicable, regarding operations and activities in and about all Department property. Furthermore, the contractor, its employees and agents, shall not obstruct the Department or any of its designated officials from performing their duties in response to court orders or in the maintenance of a secure and safe correctional environment. The contractor shall comply with the Department's policies and procedures relating to employee conduct.
- d. The Department has a zero tolerance policy for any form of sexual misconduct to include staff/contractor/volunteer on offender, or offender on offender, sexual harassment, sexual assault, sexual abuse, and/or consensual sex.
 - 1) Any contractor or contractor's employee or agent who witnesses any form of sexual misconduct must immediately report it to the warden of the institution. If a contractor or contractor's employee or agent fails to report or knowingly condones sexual harassment or sexual contact with or between offenders, the Department may cancel the contract, or at the Department's sole discretion, require the contractor to remove the employee/agent from providing services under the contract.
 - 2) Any contractor or contractor's employee or agent who engages in sexual abuse shall be prohibited from entering the institution and shall be reported to law enforcement agencies and licensing bodies, as appropriate.
- e. The contractor, its employees, and its agents shall not interact with the offenders except as is necessary to perform the requirements of the contract. The contractor, its employees and agents shall not give anything to nor accept anything from the offenders except in the normal performance of the contract.
- f. If any contractor or contractor's employee or agent is denied access into the institution for any reason or is denied approval to provide service to the Department for any reason stated herein, it shall not relieve the contractor of any requirements of the contract. If the contractor is unable to

perform the requirements of the contract for any reason, the contractor shall be considered in breach.

3.1.15 Pursuant to section 34.165, RSMo, and 1 CSR 40-1.050, a five to fifteen (5-15) bonus point preference shall be granted to vendors including products and/or services manufactured, produced or assembled by a qualified nonprofit organization for the blind established pursuant to 41 U.S.C. sections 46 to 48c or a sheltered workshop holding a certificate of approval from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education pursuant to section 178.920, RSMo.

a. In order to qualify for the five to fifteen (5-15) bonus points, the following conditions must be met and the following evidence must be provided:

- 1) The vendor must either be an organization for the blind or sheltered workshop or must be proposing to utilize an organization for the blind/sheltered workshop as a subcontractor and/or supplier in an amount that must equal, at a minimum, the greater of \$5,000 or 2% of the total dollar value of the contract for purchases not exceeding \$10 million.
- 2) The services performed or the products provided by the organization for the blind or sheltered workshop must provide a commercially useful function related to the delivery of the contractually required service/product in a manner that will constitute an added value to the contract and shall be performed/provided exclusive to the performance of the contract. Therefore, if the services performed or the products provided by the organization for the blind or sheltered workshop are utilized, to any extent, in the vendor's obligations outside of the contract, it shall not be considered a valid added value to the contract and shall not qualify as participation in accordance with this clause.
- 3) If the vendor is proposing participation by an organization for the blind or sheltered workshop, in order to receive evaluation consideration for participation by the organization for the blind or sheltered workshop, the vendor must provide the requested information with the bid.
- 4) A sliding scale for the award of points shall range from a minimum of five (5) points to a maximum of fifteen (15) points. The award of the minimum five (5) points shall be based on the bid containing a commitment that the participating nonprofit organization or workshop is providing the greater of two percent (2%) or five thousand dollars (\$5,000) of the total contract value of bids for purchases not exceeding ten (10) million dollars.

b. Where the commitment in the bid exceeds the minimum level set forth in section 34.165, RSMo to obtain five (5) points, the awarded points shall exceed the minimum five (5) points, up to a maximum of fifteen (15) points. As the statute sets out a minimum of five (5) points for a minimum two percent (2%) commitment, each percent of commitment is worth two and one-half (2.5) points. The formula to determine the awarded points for commitments above the two percent (2%) minimum shall be calculated based on the commitment in the bid (which in the formula will be expressed as a number [Vendor's Commitment Number below], not as a percentage) times two and one-half (2.5) points:

$$\text{Vendor's Commitment Number} \times 2.5 \text{ points} = \text{Awarded Points}$$

Examples: A commitment of three percent (3%) would be calculated as: $3 \times 2.5 \text{ points} = 7.5$ awarded points. A commitment of five and one-half percent (5.5%) would be calculated as: $5.5 \times 2.5 \text{ points} = 13.75$ awarded points. If, instead of a percentage, a vendor's bid lists a dollar figure that is over the minimum amount, the dollar figure shall be converted into the percentage of the vendor's total contract value for calculation of the awarded points. Commitments at or above six percent (6%) receive the maximum of fifteen (15) points.

- Participation Commitment – The vendor must complete EXHIBIT C, Participation Commitment, by identifying the organization for the blind or sheltered workshop, the amount of participation committed, and the commercially useful products/services to be provided by the listed organization for the blind or sheltered workshop. If the vendor submitting the bid is an organization for the blind or sheltered workshop, the vendor must be listed in the appropriate table on the Participation Commitment Form.
- Documentation of Intent to Participate – The vendor must either provide a properly completed EXHIBIT D, Documentation of Intent to Participate Form or must provide a letter of intent recently signed by the proposed Organization for the Blind or Sheltered Workshop which: (1) must describe the products/services the organization for the blind/sheltered workshop will provide and (2) should include evidence of the organization for the blind/sheltered workshop qualifications (e.g. copy of certificate or Certificate Number for Missouri Sheltered Workshop).

NOTE: If the vendor submitting the bid is an organization for the blind or sheltered workshop, the vendor is not required to complete Exhibit D, Documentation of Intent to Participate Form or provide a letter of intent.

- e. Commitment – If the vendor’s bid is awarded, the organization for the blind or sheltered workshop participation committed to by the vendor on Exhibit C, Participation Commitment, shall be interpreted as a contractual requirement.

Service-Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises (SDVEs)

- 3.1.16 Pursuant to section 34.074, RSMo, and 1 CSR 40-1.050, the state agency has a goal of awarding three (3) percent of all contracts for the performance of any job or service to qualified service-disabled veteran business enterprises (SDVEs). A three (3) point bonus preference shall be granted to vendors including products and/or services manufactured, produced or assembled by a qualified SDVE.
- a. In order to qualify for the three bonus points, the following conditions must be met and the following evidence must be provided:
 - 1) The vendor must either be an SDVE or must be proposing to utilize an SDVE as a subcontractor and/or supplier that provides at least three percent (3%) of the total contract value.
 - 2) The services performed or the products provided by the SDVE must provide a commercially useful function related to the delivery of the contractually-required service/product in a manner that will constitute an added value to the contract and shall be performed/provided exclusive to the performance of the contract. Therefore, if the services performed or the products provided by the SDVE are utilized, to any extent, in the vendor’s obligations outside of the contract, it shall not be considered a valid added value to the contract and shall not qualify as participation in accordance with this clause.
 - 3) In order to receive evaluation consideration for participation by an SDVE, the vendor must provide the following information with the bid:

- Participation Commitment - The vendor must complete Exhibit C, Participation Commitment, by identifying each proposed SDVE, the committed percentage of participation for each SDVE, and the commercially useful products/services to be provided by the listed SDVE. If the vendor submitting the bid is a qualified SDVE, the vendor must be listed in the appropriate table on the Participation Commitment Form.
- Documentation of Intent to Participate – The vendor must either provide a properly completed Exhibit D, Documentation of Intent to Participate Form or must provide a letter of intent recently signed by the proposed SDVE which: (1) must describe the products/services the SDVE will provide and (2) must include the SDV Documents described below as evidence that the SDVE is qualified, as defined herein.
- Service-Disabled Veteran (SDV) Documents – If a participating organization is an SDVE, unless previously submitted within the past three (3) years to the state agency or to the Office of Administration, Division of Purchasing, the vendor must provide the following Service-Disabled Veteran (SDV) documents.
- A copy of the SDV’s Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214), and a copy of the SDV’s disability rating letter issued by the Department of Veterans Affairs establishing a service connected disability rating, or a Department of Defense determination of service connected disability.

NOTE:

- a) If the vendor submitting the bid is a qualified SDVE, the vendor must include the SDV Documents as evidence that the vendor qualifies as an SDVE. However, the vendor is not required to complete Exhibit E, Documentation of Intent to Participate Form or provide a letter of intent.
- b) If the SDVE and SDV are listed on the following Internet address, the vendor is not required to prove the SDV Documents listed above.

- b. Commitment – If awarded a contract, the SDVE participation committed to by the vendor on Exhibit C, Participation Commitment, shall be interpreted as a contractual requirement.
- c. Definition – Qualified SDVE:
 - 1) SDVE is doing business as a Missouri firm, corporation, or individual or maintaining a Missouri office or place of business, not including an office of a registered agent;
 - 2) SDVE has not less than fifty-one percent (51%) of the business owned by one (1) or more service-disabled veterans (SDVs) or, in the case of any publicly-owned business, not less than fifty-one percent (51%) of the stock of which is owned by one (1) or more SDVs;
 - 3) SDVE has the management and daily business operations controlled by one (1) or more SDVs;
 - 4) SDVE has a copy of the SDV’s Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214), and a copy of the SDV’s disability rating letter issued by the Department of Veterans Affairs establishing a service connected disability rating, or a Department of Defense determination of service connected disability; and

- 5) SDVE possesses the power to make day-to-day as well as major decisions on matters of management, policy, and operation.
- 3.1.17 Substitution of Personnel - The contractor agrees and understands that the State of Missouri's agreement to the contract is predicated in part on the utilization of the specific key individual(s) and/or personnel qualifications identified in the bid. Therefore, the contractor agrees that no substitution of such specific key individual(s) and/or personnel qualifications shall be made without the prior written approval of the Department. The contractor further agrees that any substitution made pursuant to this paragraph must be equal or better than originally proposed and that the Department's approval of a substitution shall not be construed as an acceptance of the substitution's performance potential. The State of Missouri agrees that an approval of a substitution will not be unreasonably withheld.
- 3.1.18 Authorized Personnel: The contractor shall only employ personnel authorized to work in the United States in accordance with applicable federal and state laws. This includes but is not limited to the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act (IIRIRA) and INA Section 274A.
- a. If the contractor is found to be in violation of this requirement or the applicable state, federal and local laws and regulations, and if the State of Missouri has reasonable cause to believe that the contractor has knowingly employed individuals who are not eligible to work in the United States, the state shall have the right to cancel the contract immediately without penalty or recourse and suspend or debar the contractor from doing business with the state.
 - b. The contractor shall agree to fully cooperate with any audit or investigation from federal, state, or local law enforcement agencies.
 - c. If the contractor meets the definition of a business entity as defined in section 285.525, RSMo, pertaining to section 285.530, RSMo, the contractor shall maintain enrollment and participation in the E-Verify federal work authorization program with respect to the employees hired after enrollment in the program who are proposed to work in connection with the contracted services included herein. If the contractor's business status changes during the life of the contract to become a business entity as defined in section 285.525, RSMo, pertaining to section 285.530, RSMo, then the contractor shall, prior to the performance of any services as a business entity under the contract:
 - 1) Enroll and participate in the E-Verify federal work authorization program with respect to the employees hired after enrollment in the program who are proposed to work in connection with the services required herein; AND
 - 2) Provide to the Department the documentation required in the Exhibit E, Business Entity Certification, Enrollment Documentation, and Affidavit of Work Authorization affirming said company's/individual's enrollment and participation in the E-Verify federal work authorization program; AND
 - 3) Submit to the Department a completed, notarized Affidavit of Work Authorization provided in the Exhibit E, Business Entity Certification, Enrollment Documentation, and Affidavit of Work Authorization.
 - d. In accordance with subsection 2 of section 285.530, RSMo, the contractor should renew their Affidavit of Work Authorization annually. A valid Affidavit of Work Authorization is necessary to award any new contracts.
- 3.1.19 Contractor Status - The contractor is an independent contractor and shall not represent the contractor or the contractor's employees to be employees of the State of Missouri or a Department of the State of Missouri. The contractor shall assume all legal and financial responsibility for salaries, taxes, FICA, employee fringe benefits, workers compensation, employee insurance, minimum wage requirements, overtime, etc., and agrees to indemnify, save, and hold the State of Missouri, its officers, agents, and employees, harmless from and against, any and all loss; cost (including attorney fees); and damage of any kind related to such matters.

- 3.1.20 Coordination - The contractor shall fully coordinate all contract activities with those activities of the Department. As the work of the contractor progresses, advice and information on matters covered by the contract shall be made available by the contractor to the Department or the Department throughout the effective period of the contract.
- 3.1.21 Property of State - All documents, data, reports, supplies, equipment, and accomplishments prepared, furnished, or completed by the contractor pursuant to the terms of the contract shall become the property of the State of Missouri. Upon expiration, termination, or cancellation of the contract, said items shall become the property of the State of Missouri.
- 3.1.22 Confidentiality:
- a. The contractor shall agree and understand that all discussions with the contractor and all information gained by the contractor as a result of the contractor's performance under the contract shall be confidential and that no reports, documentation, or material prepared as required by the contract shall be released to the public without the prior written consent of the Department.
 - b. If required by the Department, the contractor and any required contractor personnel must sign specific documents regarding confidentiality, security, or other similar documents upon request. Failure of the contractor and any required personnel to sign such documents shall be considered a breach of contract and subject to the cancellation provisions of this document.
- 3.1.23 Criminal Justice Information System (CJIS) Security Awareness - Criminal Justice Information is any information collected by the FBI (Federal Bureau of Investigation), MSHP (Missouri State Highway patrol) and other criminal justice entities and includes personally identifiable information. It includes ALL information viewed directly from state and federal systems and also data obtained from those sources.
- a. All Criminal Justice Information is sensitive information and is privileged.
 - b. If the contractor acquires any Criminal Justice Information by virtue of the performance of this contract, regardless of the method of acquisition, the contractor is not authorized to use or disseminate the information in any form.
 - c. The contractor must not, at any time, directly or indirectly disclose any Criminal Justice Information learned during the performance of this contract.
 - d. Unauthorized access, use, or dissemination of CJIS data is unlawful, and may result in the imposition of administrative sanctions and/or state/federal criminal penalties. If the contractor has information to indicate this has occurred, the contractor must report it to the Department of Corrections.
 - e. Misuse of official information is a Class A Misdemeanor. Section 576.050.2 of the Revised Statute of Missouri states, "A person commits the offense of misuse of official information if he or she recklessly obtains or discloses information from the Missouri uniform law enforcement system (MULES) or the National Crime Information Center System (NCIC), or any other criminal justice information sharing system that contains individually identifiable information for private or personal use, or for a purpose other than in connection with their official duties and performance of their job."
- 3.1.24 Contractor Equipment Use:
- a. Title to any equipment required by the contract shall be held by and vested in the contractor. The State of Missouri shall not be liable in the event of loss, incident, destruction, theft, damage, etc., for the equipment including, but not limited to, devices, wires, etc. It shall be the contractor's sole

responsibility to obtain insurance coverage for such loss in an amount that the contractor deems appropriate.

- 3.1.25 The contractor shall not perform any work under the contract that by Missouri law (section 290.250, RSMo) requires prevailing wage. The contractor must notify the Department if any requested work would involve prevailing wage; the Department shall then arrange for said work outside the subject contract in accordance with Missouri law.

4. BID SUBMISSION, EVALUATION, AND AWARD INFORMATION

4.1 Submission of Bids:

- 4.1.1 On-line Bid - If a registered vendor is responding electronically through the MissouriBUYS System website, in addition to completing the on-line pricing, the registered vendor should submit completed exhibits, forms, and other information concerning the bid as an attachment to the electronic bid. The registered vendor is instructed to review the IFB submission provisions carefully to ensure they are providing all required pricing, including applicable renewal pricing. Instructions on how a registered vendor responds to a bid on-line are available on the MissouriBUYS System website at: <https://missouribuys.mo.gov/bidboard.html>.
- a. The exhibits, forms, and Pricing Page(s) provided herein can be saved into a word processing document, completed by a registered vendor, and then sent as an attachment to the electronic submission. Other information requested or required may be sent as an attachment. Additional instructions for submitting electronic attachments are on the MissouriBUYS System website. Be sure to include the solicitation/opportunity (OPP) number, company name, and a contact name on any electronic attachments.
 - b. In addition, a registered vendor may submit the exhibits, forms, Pricing Page(s), etc., through mail or courier service. However, any such submission must be received prior to the specified end date and time.
 - c. If a registered vendor submits an electronic and hard copy bid response and if such responses are not identical, the vendor should explain which response is valid. In the absence of an explanation, the State of Missouri shall consider the response which serves its best interest.
- 4.1.2 Hard Copy Bid - If the vendor is submitting a bid via the mail or a courier service or is hand delivering the bid, the vendor should include completed exhibits, forms, and other information concerning the bid (including completed Pricing Page(s) with the bid. The vendor is instructed to review the IFB submission provisions carefully to ensure they are providing all required pricing, including applicable renewal pricing.
- a. The bid should be page numbered.
 - b. Recycled Products - The State of Missouri recognizes the limited nature of our resources and the leadership role of government agencies in regard to the environment. Accordingly, the vendor is requested to print the bid double-sided using recycled paper, if possible, and minimize or eliminate the use of non-recyclable materials such as plastic report covers, plastic dividers, vinyl sleeves, and binding. Lengthy bids may be submitted in a notebook or binder.
- 4.1.3 Open Records – Pursuant to section 610.021, RSMo, the bid shall be considered an open record after the bids are opened. Therefore, the bidder is advised not to include any information that the bidder does not want to be viewed by the public, including personal identifying information such as social security numbers.
- 4.1.4 Contact – Any and all communication from bidders regarding specifications, requirements, competitive bid process, etc. related to the bid document must be referred to the Buyer of Record identified on the first page of this document. Such communication should be received at least ten calendar days prior to the official bid opening date.
- 4.1.5 Compliance with Terms and Conditions – The bidder is cautioned when submitting pre-printed terms and conditions or other type material to make sure such documents do not contain other terms and conditions which conflict with those of the IFB and its contractual requirements. The bidder agrees that in the event of conflict between any of the bidder's terms and conditions and those contained in the IFB, that the IFB

shall govern. Taking exception to the State's terms and conditions may render a bidder's bid non-responsive and remove it from consideration for award.

4.1.6 Bid Detail Requirements and Deviations - It is the bidder’s responsibility to submit a bid that meets all mandatory specifications stated herein. The bidder should clearly identify any and all deviations from both the mandatory and desirable specifications stated in the IFB. Any deviation from a mandatory requirement may render the bid non-responsive. Any deviation from a desirable specification may be reviewed by the Department as to its acceptability and impact on competition.

4.1.7 Business Compliance - The bidder must be in compliance with the laws regarding conducting business in the State of Missouri. The bidder certifies by signing the signature page of this original document and any amendment signature page(s) that the bidder and any proposed subcontractors either are presently in compliance with such laws or shall be in compliance with such laws prior to any resulting contract award. The bidder shall provide documentation of compliance upon request by the Department. The compliance to conduct business in the state shall include but may not be limited to:

- Registration of business name (if applicable)
- Certificate of authority to transact business/certificate of good standing (if applicable)
- Taxes (e.g., city/county/state/federal)
- State and local certifications (e.g., professions/occupations/activities)
- Licenses and permits (e.g., city/county license, sales permits)
- Insurance (e.g., worker’s compensation/unemployment compensation)

4.2 Evaluation of Cost:

4.2.1 Price shall be considered firm for the duration of the contract period indicated on the Notice of Award of a contract.

4.2.2 The evaluation shall cover the original contract period plus the renewal period. The cost evaluation shall include all mandatory requirements, including, wiring, dishes, hardware, SD cable/satellite programming services, installation, and maintenance. However, the Department reserves the right to evaluate optional items if deemed necessary.

4.2.3 The bidder shall submit a firm fixed price on EXHIBIT A, Pricing Page for the line item. All pricing shall be quoted FOB Destination, Prepaid and Allowed.

4.2.4 The bidder should complete the “Terms” and the “Bidder’s Acceptance of the State Purchasing Card” sections on EXHIBIT A, Pricing Page.

4.2.5 Determination of Lowest Priced Bidder including Consideration of Preferences - The bidder with the most points after completing the cost evaluation and determining bonus points as specified below is considered the lowest bidder.

a. Objective Evaluation of Cost –Prices on the Pricing Page shall be multiplied by 12 to determine the total annual cost for the original contract period and each potential renewal period. Each contract period total shall then be added together and the resulting sum shall be used in the following formula:

$$\frac{\text{Lowest Responsive Bidder's Price}}{\text{Compared Bidder's Price}} \times \frac{\text{Maximum Cost}}{\text{Evaluation Points (100)}} = \text{Assigned Cost Points}$$

NOTE: The prompt payment discount terms on contracts will not be used in any cost calculation.

4.3 Determination of Award:

- 4.3.1 Award shall be made to the lowest priced responsive bidder. Other factors that affect the determination of the lowest price responsive vendor include consideration of Blind/Sheltered Workshop Preference, and the Missouri Services Disabled Veteran Preference explained in sections 3.1.15 and 3.1.16.
- 4.3.2 Determination of Lowest Priced Bidder including Consideration of Preferences - After completing the cost evaluation and determining preference bonus points, the bidder with the most points is considered the lowest bidder. Total points shall be computed for the total evaluated bid price as follows:

$$\text{Total Assigned Cost Points} + \text{earned preference points} = \text{Total Points}$$

- 4.3.3 The Department reserves the right to reject any bid which is determined unacceptable for reasons which may include but are not necessarily limited to: 1) failure of the bidder to meet mandatory general performance specifications; and/or 2) failure of the bidder to meet mandatory technical specifications; and/or; 3) receipt of any information, from any source, regarding delivery of unsatisfactory product or service by the bidder within the past three years. As deemed in its best interests, the Department reserves the right to clarify any and all portions of any bidder's offer.

4.4 Unit of Measure:

- 4.4.1 If the unit of measure specified on the attached pricing pages is different than the manner in which the vendor offers the item, then the unit of measure being proposed by the vendor must be clearly identified on the pricing page. All mathematical conversions should be shown by the vendor, and must be provided upon specific request from the buyer.
- 4.4.2 In the cost evaluation, a unit price conversion will be done to fairly evaluate bid prices. However, for any resulting contract, the unit of measure bid will be the unit of measure awarded. Vendors are encouraged to contact the buyer prior to submission of their bid to discuss anticipated unit modifications. The vendor is cautioned that the Department reserves the right to clarify the unit of measure modification or to disqualify the bid for that line item if the unit of measure modification is not deemed appropriate or in the best interest of the Department.

4.5 Other Bid Submission Requirements:

- 4.5.1 Affidavit of Work Authorization and Documentation - Pursuant to section 285.530, RSMo, if the bidder meets the section 285.525, RSMo, definition of a "business entity" ([Section: 285.0525 Definitions, RSMO 285.525](#)), the bidder must affirm the bidder's enrollment and participation in the E-Verify federal work authorization program with respect to the employees hired after enrollment in the program who are proposed to work in connection with the services requested herein. The bidder should complete applicable portions of Exhibit E, Business Entity Certification, Enrollment Documentation, and Affidavit of Work Authorization. The applicable portions of Exhibit E, must be submitted prior to an award of a contract.
- 4.5.2 Miscellaneous Information – The bidder should complete and submit Exhibit F, Miscellaneous Information.
- 4.5.3 Business Compliance - The bidder must be in compliance with the laws regarding conducting business in the State of Missouri. The bidder certifies by signing the signature page of this original document and any amendment signature page(s) or by submitting an on-line bid that the bidder and any proposed subcontractors either are presently in compliance with such laws or shall be in compliance with such laws prior to any resulting contract award. The bidder shall provide documentation of compliance upon request by the Department. The compliance to conduct business in the state shall include, but not necessarily be limited to:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS -- INVITATION FOR BID**

1. TERMINOLOGY/DEFINITIONS

Whenever the following words and expressions appear in an Invitation for Bid (IFB) document or any addendum thereto, the definition or meaning described below shall apply.

- a. **1 CSR 40-1 (Code of State Regulations)** refers to the rule that provides the public with a description of the Division of Purchasing and Materials Management within the Office of Administration. This rule fulfills the statutory requirement of section 536.023(3), RSMo.
- b. **Agency and/or Department** means the Missouri Department of Corrections.
- c. **Addendum** means a written official modification to an IFB.
- d. **Amendment** means a written, official modification to a contract.
- e. **Attachment** applies to all forms which are included with an IFB to incorporate any informational data or requirements related to the performance requirements and/or specifications.
- f. **Bid Opening Date and Time** and similar expressions mean the exact deadline required by the IFB for the receipt of sealed bids.
- g. **Bidder** means the person or organization that responds to an IFB by submitting a bid with prices to provide the equipment, supplies, and/or services as required in the IFB document.
- h. **Buyer or Buyer of Record** means the procurement staff member of the Department. The **Contact Person** as referenced herein is usually the Buyer of Record.
- i. **Contract** means a legal and binding agreement between two or more competent parties for consideration for the procurement of equipment, supplies, and/or services.
- j. **Contractor** means a person or organization who is a successful bidder as a result of an IFB and who enters into a contract.
- k. **Exhibit** applies to forms which are included with an IFB for the bidder to complete and submit with the sealed bid prior to the specified opening date and time.
- l. **Invitation for Bid (IFB)** means the solicitation document issued by the Department to potential bidders for the purchase of equipment, supplies, and/or services as described in the document. The definition includes these Terms and Conditions as well as all Exhibits, Attachments, and Addendums thereto.
- m. **May** means that a certain feature, component, or action is permissible, but not required.
- n. **Must** means that a certain feature, component, or action is a mandatory condition. Failure to provide or comply will result in a bid being considered non-responsive.
- o. **Pricing Page(s)** applies to the Exhibit on which the bidder must state the price(s) applicable for the equipment, supplies, and/or services required in the IFB. The pricing pages must be completed and submitted by the bidder with the sealed bid prior to the specified bid opening date and time.
- p. **RSMo (Revised Statutes of Missouri)** refers to the body of laws enacted by the Legislature which govern the operations of all agencies of the State of Missouri. Chapter 34 of the statutes is the primary chapter governing the procurement operations of the Department.
- q. **Shall** has the same meaning as the word **must**.
- r. **Should** means that a certain feature, component, and/or action is desirable but not mandatory.

2. APPLICABLE LAWS AND REGULATIONS

- a. The contract shall be construed according to the laws of the State of Missouri. The contractor shall comply with all local, state, and federal laws and regulations related to the performance of the contract to the extent that the same may be applicable.
- b. To the extent that a provision of the contract is contrary to the Constitution or laws of the State of Missouri or of the United States, the provisions shall be void and unenforceable. However, the balance of the contract shall remain in force between the parties unless terminated by consent of both the contractor and the Department.
- c. The contractor must be registered and maintain good standing with the Secretary of State of the State of Missouri and other regulatory agencies, as may be required by law or regulations.

- d. The contractor must timely file and pay all Missouri sales, withholding, corporate and any other required Missouri tax returns and taxes, including interest and additions to tax.
- e. The exclusive venue for any legal proceeding relating to or arising out of the IFB or resulting contract shall be in the Circuit Court of Cole County, Missouri.
- f. The contractor shall only utilize personnel authorized to work in the United States in accordance with applicable federal and state laws and Executive Order 07-13 for work performed in the United States.

3. CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION

- a. All contractual administration will be carried out by the Buyer of Record or authorized Department Purchasing Section designee. Communications pertaining to contract administration matters will be addressed to: Department of Corrections, Purchasing Section, PO Box 236, Jefferson City, MO 65102.
- b. The Buyer of Record/authorized designee is the only person authorized to approve changes to any of the requirements of the contract.

4. OPEN COMPETITION/INVITATION FOR BID DOCUMENT

- a. It shall be the bidder's responsibility to ask questions, request changes or clarification, or otherwise advise the Department if any language, specifications or requirements of an IFB appear to be ambiguous, contradictory, and/or arbitrary, or appear to inadvertently restrict or limit the requirements or evaluation process stated in the IFB to a single source. Any and all communication from bidders regarding specifications, requirements, competitive bid process, etc., must be directed to the Buyer of Record of the Department, unless the IFB specifically refers the bidder to another contact. Such communication should be received at least ten (10) calendar days prior to the official bid opening date.
- b. Every attempt shall be made to ensure that the bidder receives an adequate and prompt response. However, in order to maintain a fair and equitable bid process, all bidders will be advised, via the issuance of an addendum to the IFB, of any relevant or pertinent information related to the procurement. Therefore, bidders are advised that unless specified elsewhere in the IFB, any questions received less than ten (10) calendar days prior to the IFB opening date may not be answered.
- c. Bidders are cautioned that the only official position of the State of Missouri is that which is issued by the Department in the IFB or an addendum thereto. No other means of communication, whether oral or written, shall be construed as a formal or official response or statement.
- d. The Department monitors all procurement activities to detect any possibility of deliberate restraint of competition, collusion among bidders, price-fixing by bidders, or any other anticompetitive conduct by bidders which appears to violate state and federal antitrust laws. Any suspected violation shall be referred to the Missouri Attorney General's Office for appropriate action.
- e. Some IFBs may be available for viewing and downloading on the Department's website or on the MissouriBUYS Statewide eProcurement System. For IFB's posted on MissouriBUYS, registered bidders are electronically notified of those bid opportunities that match the commodity codes for which the bidder registered in MissouriBUYS. If a registered bidder's e-mail address is incorrect, the bidder must update the e-mail address themselves on the state's MissouriBUYS Statewide eProcurement System at <https://missouribuys.mo.gov/>
- f. The Department reserves the right to officially amend or cancel an IFB after issuance. It shall be the sole responsibility of the bidder to monitor the Department's website and the MissouriBUYS Statewide eProcurement System to obtain a copy of the addendum(s). Registered bidders who received e-mail notification of the bid opportunity when the IFB was established and registered bidders who have responded to the IFB on-line prior to an addendum being issued should receive e-mail notification of the addendum(s). Registered bidders who received e-mail notification of the bid opportunity when the IFB was established and registered bidders who have responded to the bid on-line prior to a cancellation being issued should receive e-mail notification of a cancellation issued prior to the exact end date and time specified in the IFB.

5. PREPARATION OF BIDS

- a. Bidders **must** examine the entire IFB carefully. Failure to do so shall be at the bidder's risk.

- b. Unless otherwise specifically stated in the IFB, all specifications and requirements constitute minimum requirements. All bids must meet or exceed the stated specifications and requirements.
- c. Unless otherwise specifically stated in the IFB, any manufacturer names, trade names, brand names, information and/or catalog numbers listed in a specification and/or requirement are for informational purposes only and are not intended to limit competition. The bidder may offer any brand which meets or exceeds the specification for any item, but must state the manufacturer's name and model number for any such brands in the bid. In addition, the bidder shall explain, in detail, (1) the reasons why the proposed equivalent meets or exceeds the specifications and/or requirements and (2) why the proposed equivalent should not be considered an exception thereto. Bids which do not comply with the requirements and specifications are subject to rejection without clarification.
- d. Bids lacking any indication of intent to bid an alternate brand or to take an exception shall be received and considered in complete compliance with the specifications and requirements as listed in the IFB.
- e. In the event that the bidder is an agency of state government or other such political subdivision which is prohibited by law or court decision from complying with certain provisions of an IFB, such a bidder may submit a bid which contains a list of statutory limitations and identification of those prohibitive clauses. The bidder should include a complete list of statutory references and citations for each provision of the IFB which is affected by this paragraph. The statutory limitations and prohibitive clauses may be requested to be clarified in writing by the Department or be accepted without further clarification if statutory limitations and prohibitive clauses are deemed acceptable by the Department. If the Department determines clarification of the statutory limitations and prohibitive clauses is necessary, the clarification will be conducted in order to agree to language that reflects the intent and compliance of such law and/or court order and the IFB.
- f. All equipment and supplies offered in a bid must be new, of current production, and available for marketing by the manufacturer unless the IFB clearly specifies that used, reconditioned, or remanufactured equipment and supplies may be offered.
- g. Prices shall include all packing, handling and shipping charges, and shall be delivered to the Department's designated destination FOB destination, freight prepaid and allowed unless otherwise specified in the IFB.
- h. Bids, including all pricing therein, shall remain valid for 90 days from the bid opening unless otherwise indicated. If the bid is accepted, the entire bid, including all prices, shall be firm for the specified contract period.
- i. Any foreign bidder not having an Employer Identification Number assigned by the United States Internal Revenue Service (IRS) must submit a completed IRS Form W-8 prior to or with the submission of their bid in order to be considered for award.

6. SUBMISSION OF BIDS

- a. Delivered bids must be sealed in an envelope or container, and received in the Department's Purchasing office located at the address indicated on the cover page of the IFB no later than the exact opening time and date specified in the IFB. For bids posted on the MissouriBUYS Statewide eProcurement System, registered bidders may submit bids electronically through the MissouriBUYS Statewide eProcurement System at <https://missouribuys.mo.gov/>. All bids must be submitted by a duly authorized representative of the bidder's organization, contain all information required by the IFB, and be priced as required. Bidders are cautioned that bids submitted via the USPS, including first class mail, certified mail, Priority Mail and Priority Mail Express, are routed through the Office of Administration Central Mail Services and the tracking delivery time and date may not be the time and date received by the Department's Purchasing office. Regardless of delivery method, it shall be the responsibility of the bidder to ensure their bid is in the Department's Purchasing office no later than the exact opening time and date specified in the IFB.
- b. The sealed envelope or container containing a bid should be clearly marked on the outside with the official IFB number **and** the official opening date and time. Different bids should not be placed in the same envelope; however, copies of the same bid may be placed in the same envelope.
- c. A bid which has been delivered to the Department may be modified by a signed, written notice which has been received by the Department's Purchasing office prior to the official opening date and time specified. A bid may also be modified in person by the bidder or its authorized representative, provided proper

identification is presented before the official opening date and time. Telephone or telegraphic requests to modify a bid shall not be honored.

- d. A bid submitted electronically by a registered bidder may be retracted on-line prior to the official end date and time. A bid which has been delivered to the Department's Purchasing office may only be withdrawn by a signed, written document on company letterhead transmitted via mail, e-mail, or facsimile which has been received by the Department's Purchasing office prior to the official opening date and time specified. A bid may also be withdrawn in person by the bidder or its authorized representative provided proper identification is presented before the official opening date and time. Telephone or telegraphic requests to withdraw a bid shall not be honored.
- e. A bid may also be withdrawn after the bid opening through submission of a written request by an authorized representative of the bidder. Justification of a withdrawal decision may include a significant error or exposure of bid information that may cause irreparable harm to the bidder.
- f. When submitting a bid electronically, the registered bidder indicates acceptance of all IFB requirements, terms and conditions by clicking on the "Accept" button on the Overview tab. Bidders submitting a hard copy must sign and return the IFB cover page or, if applicable, the cover page of the last addendum thereto in order to constitute acceptance by the bidder of all the IFB terms and conditions. Failure to do so may result in the rejection of the bid unless the bidder's full compliance with those documents is indicated elsewhere within the bidder's response.
- g. Faxed and e-mailed bids shall not be accepted; however, faxed and e-mail no-bid notifications shall be accepted.

7. BID OPENING

- a. Bid openings are public on the opening date and time specified in the IFB document. Names, locations, and prices of respondents shall be read at the bid opening. All bidders may view the same bid response information on the MissouriBUYS Statewide eProcurement System. The Department will not provide prices or other bid information via the telephone.
- b. Bids which are not received in the Department's Purchasing office prior to the official opening date and time shall be considered late, regardless of the degree of lateness, and normally will not be opened. Late bids may only be opened under extraordinary circumstances in accordance with 1 CSR 40-1.050.

8. PREFERENCES

- a. In the evaluation of bids, preferences shall be applied in accordance with Chapter 34 RSMo. Contractors should apply the same preferences in selecting subcontractors.
- b. By virtue of statutory authority, a preference will be given to materials, products, supplies, provisions and all other articles produced, manufactured, made or grown within the State of Missouri and to all firms, corporations or individuals doing business as Missouri firms, corporations or individuals. Such preference shall be given when quality is equal or better and delivered price is the same or less.

9. EVALUATION/AWARD

- a. Any clerical error, apparent on its face, may be corrected by the Buyer of Record before contract award. Upon discovering an apparent clerical error, the Buyer of Record shall contact the bidder and request clarification of the intended bid. The correction shall be incorporated in the notice of award. Examples of apparent clerical errors are: 1) misplacement of a decimal point; and 2) obvious mistake in designation of unit.
- b. Any pricing information submitted by a bidder shall be subject to evaluation if deemed by the Department to be in the best interest of the State of Missouri.
- c. The bidder is encouraged to propose price discounts for prompt payment or propose other price discounts that would benefit the Department. However, unless otherwise specified in the IFB, pricing shall be evaluated at the maximum potential financial liability to the Department.
- d. Awards shall be made to the bidder(s) whose bid (1) complies with all mandatory specifications and requirements of the IFB and (2) is the lowest and best bid, considering price, responsibility of the bidder,

and all other evaluation criteria specified in the IFB and (3) complies with sections 34.010 and 34.070 RSMo and Executive Order 04-09.

- e. In the event all bidders fail to meet the same mandatory requirement in an IFB, the Department reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to waive that requirement for all bidders and to proceed with the evaluation. In addition, the Department reserves the right to waive any minor irregularity or technicality found in any individual bid.
- f. The Department reserves the right to reject any and all bids.
- g. When evaluating a bid, the Department reserves the right to consider relevant information and fact, whether gained from a bid, from a bidder, from a bidder's references, or from any other source.
- h. Any information submitted with the bid, regardless of the format or placement of such information, may be considered in making decisions related to the responsiveness and merit of a bid and the award of a contract.
- i. Any award of a contract shall be made by notification from the Department to the successful bidder. The Department reserves the right to make awards by item, group of items, or an all or none basis. The grouping of items awarded shall be determined by the Department based upon factors such as item similarity, location, administrative efficiency, or other considerations in the best interest of the State of Missouri.
- j. All bids and associated documentation submitted on or before the official opening date and time will be considered open records pursuant to section 610.021 RSMo.
- k. The Department maintains records of all bid file material for review. Bidders who include an e-mail address with their bid will be notified of the award results via e-mail if requested.
- l. The Department reserves the right to request clarification of any portion of the bidder's response in order to verify the intent of the bidder. The bidder is cautioned, however, that its response may be subject to acceptance or rejection without further clarification.
- m. Any bid award protest must be received within ten (10) business days after the date of award in accordance with the requirements of 1 CSR 40-1.050 (9).
- n. The final determination of contract award(s) shall be made by the Department.

10. CONTRACT/PURCHASE ORDER

- a. By submitting a bid, the bidder agrees to furnish any and all equipment, supplies and/or services specified in the IFB, at the prices quoted, pursuant to all requirements and specifications contained therein.
- b. A binding contract shall consist of: (1) the IFB and any addendums thereto, (2) the contractor's response (bid) to the IFB, (3) clarification of the bid, if any, and (4) the Department's acceptance of the response (bid) by "notice of award" or by "purchase order." All Exhibits and Attachments included in the IFB shall be incorporated into the contract by reference.
- c. A notice of award issued by the Department does not constitute an authorization for shipment of equipment or supplies or a directive to proceed with services. Before providing equipment, supplies and/or services for the Department, the contractor must receive a properly authorized purchase order or other form of authorization given to the contractor at the discretion of the Department.
- d. The contract expresses the complete agreement of the parties and performance shall be governed solely by the specifications and requirements contained therein. Any change to the contract, whether by modification and/or supplementation, must be accomplished by a formal contract amendment signed and approved by and between the duly authorized representative of the contractor and the Department prior to the effective date of such modification. The contractor expressly and explicitly understands and agrees that no other method and/or no other document, including correspondence, acts, and oral communications by or from any person, shall be used or construed as an amendment or modification to the contract.

11. INVOICING AND PAYMENT

- a. The State of Missouri does not pay state or federal taxes unless otherwise required under law or regulation.
- b. For each purchase order received, an invoice must be submitted that references the purchase order number and must be itemized in accordance with items listed on the purchase order. Failure to comply with this requirement may delay processing of invoices for payment.
- c. Payment for all equipment, supplies, and/or services required herein shall be made in arrears unless otherwise indicated in the IFB.

- d. The Department assumes no obligation for equipment, supplies, and/or services shipped or provided in excess of the quantity ordered. Any unauthorized quantity is subject to the Department's rejection and shall be returned to the contractor at the contractor's expense.
- e. All invoices for equipment, supplies, and/or services purchased by the Department shall be subject to late payment charges as provided in section 34.055 RSMo.
- f. The Department reserves the right to purchase goods and services using the state purchasing card.

12. DELIVERY

- a. Time is of the essence. Deliveries of equipment, supplies, and/or services must be made no later than the time stated in the contract or within a reasonable period of time if a specific time is not stated.
- b. A Missouri Uniformed Law Enforcement System (MULES) background check may be required on the contractor's delivery driver prior to allowing a delivery vehicle entrance to certain institutions. A valid Missouri driver's license is required from the driver to perform the MULES background check. If the driver does not have a valid Missouri driver's license, their social security number and date of birth are required. If a driver or carrier refuses to provide the appropriate information to conduct a MULES background check, or if information received from the background check prohibits the driver or carrier from entering the institution, the delivery will be refused. Additional delivery costs associated with re-deliveries or contracting with another carrier for delivery shall be the responsibility of the contractor.
- c. Unless a pallet exchange is requested at the time of delivery, all pallets used in the delivery of equipment and supplies shall become property of the Department.

13. INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE

- a. No equipment, supplies, and/or services received by the Department pursuant to a contract shall be deemed accepted until the Department has had reasonable opportunity to inspect said equipment, supplies, and/or services.
- b. All equipment, supplies, and/or services which do not comply with the specifications and/or requirements, or which are otherwise unacceptable or defective, may be rejected. In addition, all equipment, supplies, and/or services which are discovered to be defective, or which do not conform to any warranty of the contractor upon inspection (or at any later time if the defects contained were not reasonably ascertainable upon the initial inspection), may be rejected.
- c. The Department reserves the right to return any such rejected shipment at the contractor's expense for full credit or replacement and to specify a reasonable date by which replacements must be received.
- d. The Department's right to reject any unacceptable equipment, supplies, and/or services shall not exclude any other legal, equitable or contractual remedies the state may have.

14. WARRANTY

- a. The contractor expressly warrants that all equipment, supplies, and/or services provided shall: (1) conform to each and every specification, drawing, sample or other description which was furnished to or adopted by the Department, (2) be fit and sufficient for the purpose expressed in the IFB, (3) be merchantable, (4) be of good materials and workmanship, and (5) be free from defect.
- b. Such warranty shall survive delivery and shall not be deemed waived either by reason of the Department's acceptance of or payment for said equipment, supplies, and/or services.

15. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

- a. Elected or appointed officials or employees of the State of Missouri or any political subdivision thereof, serving in an executive or administrative capacity, must comply with sections 105.452 and 105.454 RSMo regarding conflict of interest.
- b. The contractor hereby covenants that at the time of the submission of the bid the contractor has no other contractual relationships which would create any actual or perceived conflict of interest. The contractor further agrees that during the term of the contract neither the contractor nor any of its employees shall acquire any other contractual relationships which create such a conflict.

16. CONTRACTOR STATUS

- a. The contractor represents itself to be an independent contractor offering such services to the general public and shall not represent itself to be an employee of the State of Missouri. Therefore, the contractor shall assume all legal and financial responsibility for taxes, FICA, employee fringe benefits, workers compensation, employee insurance, minimum wage requirements, overtime, etc., and agrees to indemnify, save, and hold the State of Missouri, its officers, agents, and employees, harmless from and against, any and all loss, costs (including attorney fees), and damage of any kind related to such matters.

17. REMEDIES AND RIGHTS

- a. No provision in the contract shall be construed, expressly or implied, as a waiver by the Department of any existing or future right and/or remedy available by law in the event of any claim by the Department of the contractor's default or breach of contract.
- b. The contractor agrees and understands that the contract shall constitute an assignment by the contractor to the Department of all rights, title and interest in and to all causes of action that the contractor may have under the antitrust laws of the United States or the Department for which causes of action have accrued or will accrue as the result of or in relation to the particular equipment, supplies, and/or services purchased or procured by the contractor in the fulfillment of the contract with the Department.

18. SEVERABILITY

- a. If any provision of this contract or the application thereof is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this contract which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this contract are declared to be severable.

19. CANCELLATION OF CONTRACT

- a. In the event of material breach of the contractual obligations by the contractor, the Department may cancel the contract. At its sole discretion, the Department may give the contractor an opportunity to cure the breach or to explain how the breach will be cured. The actual cure must be completed within no more than ten (10) working days from notification, or at a minimum, the contractor must provide the Department within ten (10) working days from notification a written plan detailing how the contractor intends to cure the breach.
- b. If the contractor fails to cure the breach, or if circumstances demand immediate action, the Department will issue a notice of cancellation terminating the contract immediately. If it is determined the Department improperly cancelled the contract, such cancellation shall serve as notice of termination for convenience in accordance with the contract.
- c. If the Department cancels the contract for breach, the Department reserves the right to obtain the equipment, supplies, and/or services to be provided pursuant to the contract from other sources and upon such terms and in such manner as the Department deems appropriate and charge the contractor for any additional costs incurred thereby.
- d. The contractor understands and agrees that if the funds required to fund the contract are appropriated by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, the contract shall not be binding upon the Department for any contract period in which funds have not been appropriated, and the Department shall not be liable for any costs associated with termination caused by lack of appropriations.
- e. If the Department has reasonable cause to believe that the contractor has knowingly employed individuals who are not eligible to work in the United States in violation of federal law, the Department shall declare a breach and cancel the contract immediately without incurring any penalty.

20. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

- a. The Department reserves the right to terminate the contract at any time for the convenience of the Department, without penalty or recourse, by giving notice to the contractor at least thirty (30) calendar days prior to the effective date of such termination. The contractor shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for services and/or supplies or equipment delivered to and accepted by the Department pursuant to the contract prior to the effective date of termination.

21. ASSIGNMENT OF CONTRACT

- a. The contractor shall neither assign nor transfer any of the rights, interests, or obligations of the contract without the prior written consent of the Department.

22. COMMUNICATIONS AND NOTICES

- a. Any notice to the contractor shall be deemed sufficient when e-mailed to the contractor at the e-mail address indicated in the contract, or transmitted by facsimile to the facsimile number indicated in the contract, or deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, and addressed to the contractor at the address indicated in the contract, or hand-carried and presented to an authorized employee of the contractor.
- b. If the contractor desires to receive written notices at a different e-mail address, facsimile number, or USPS address than what is indicated in the contract, the contractor must submit this request in writing upon notice of award.

23. FORCE MAJEURE

- a. The contractor shall not be liable for any excess costs for delayed delivery of goods or services to the Department if the failure to perform the contract arises out of causes beyond the control of, and without the fault or negligence of, the contractor. Such causes may include, however are not restricted to: acts of God, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, and freight embargoes. In all cases, the failure to perform must be beyond the control of, and without the fault or negligence of, either the contractor or any subcontractor(s). The contractor shall take all possible steps to recover from any such occurrences.

24. CONTRACT EXTENSION

- a. In the event of an extended re-procurement effort and the contract's available renewal options have been exhausted, the Department reserves the right to extend the contract. If exercised, the extension shall be for a period of time as mutually agreed to by the Department and the contractor at the same terms, conditions, provisions, and pricing in order to complete the procurement process and transition to a new contract.

25. INSURANCE

- a. The State of Missouri cannot save and hold harmless and/or indemnify the contractor or its employees against any liability incurred or arising as a result of any activity of the contractor or the contractor's employees related to the contractor's performance under the contract. Therefore, the contractor must acquire and maintain adequate liability insurance in the form(s) and amount(s) sufficient to protect the State of Missouri, its agencies, its employees, its clients, and the general public against any such loss, damage, and/or expense related to his/her performance under the contract.

26. BANKRUPTCY OR INSOLVENCY

- a. Upon filing for any bankruptcy or insolvency proceeding by or against the contractor, whether voluntary or involuntary, or upon the appointment of a receiver, trustee, or assignee for the benefit of creditors, the contractor must notify the Department immediately.
- b. Upon learning of any such actions, the Department reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to either cancel the contract or affirm the contract and hold the contractor responsible for damages.

27. INVENTIONS, PATENTS AND COPYRIGHTS

- a. The contractor shall defend, protect, and hold harmless the Department, its officers, agents, and employees against all suits of law or in equity resulting from patent and copyright infringement concerning the contractor's performance or products produced under the terms of the contract.

28. CONTRACTOR PROPERTY

- a. Upon expiration, termination or cancellation of a contract, any contractor property left in the possession of the Department after forty-five (45) calendar days shall become property of the Department.

29. NON-DISCRIMINATION AND AFFIRMATIVE ACTION

- a. In connection with the furnishing of equipment, supplies, and/or services under the contract, the contractor and all subcontractors shall agree not to discriminate against recipients of services or employees or applicants for employment on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, age, disability, or veteran status unless otherwise provided by law. If the contractor or subcontractor employs at least 50 persons, they shall have and maintain an affirmative action program which shall include:
 1. A written policy statement committing the organization to affirmative action and assigning management responsibilities and procedures for evaluation and dissemination;
 2. The identification of a person designated to handle affirmative action;
 3. The establishment of non-discriminatory selection standards, objective measures to analyze recruitment, an upward mobility system, a wage and salary structure, and standards applicable to layoff, recall, discharge, demotion, and discipline;
 4. The exclusion of discrimination from all collective bargaining agreements; and
 5. Performance of an internal audit of the reporting system to monitor execution and to provide for future planning.
- b. If discrimination by a contractor is found to exist, the Department shall take appropriate enforcement action which may include, but not necessarily be limited to, cancellation of the contract, suspension, or debarment by the Department until corrective action by the contractor is made and ensured, and referral to the Attorney General's Office, whichever enforcement action may be deemed most appropriate.

30. AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

- a. In connection with the furnishing of equipment, supplies, and/or services under the contract, the contractor and all subcontractors shall comply with all applicable requirements and provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

31. FILING AND PAYMENT OF TAXES

- a. The commissioner of administration and other agencies to which the state purchasing law applies shall not contract for goods or services with a vendor if the vendor or an affiliate of the vendor makes sales at retail of tangible personal property or for the purpose of storage, use, or consumption in this state but fails to collect and properly pay the tax as provided in chapter 144, RSMo. For the purposes of this section, "affiliate of the vendor" shall mean any person or entity that is controlled by or is under common control with the vendor, whether through stock ownership or otherwise. Therefore, a bidder's failure to maintain compliance with chapter 144, RSMo may eliminate their bid from consideration for award.

32. TITLES

- a. Titles of paragraphs used herein are for the purpose of facilitating reference only and shall not be construed to infer a contractual construction of language.
